## ON COMMITMENT

Commitment, in terms of recovery, means restoring some of the basic principles many of us were taught as children, but we lost somewhere in our self-centeredness. As Trusted Servants of the General Service structure the principles that we must now practice include willingness, self sacrifice, honesty, consideration of others, thoughtfulness, love, tolerance and, most of all, basic etiquette.

- Do we show up when we say we will? Are we on time?
- Do we mark our A.A. commitments on the calendar and then work around them, or do we attend only if it doesn't interfere with our plans?
- Do we arrange for our alternate to attend events when we are unable?
- Do we keep our alternates well informed and involved?
- Do we attend as many service activities as possible in order to become better informed, or do we do the least possible required?
- Do we tend to our responsibilities cheerfully or portray them as a drag?
- Are we able to offer criticism lovingly and based on the application of our three legacies, or do we let personalities get in the way?

All of these things are important to being committed to service in A.A., but the bottom line is: are we giving back in proportion to what has been given to us? Gratitude is an action word. It is something we show, not just something we talk about. If we give only a tenth of what has been given to us, we shall all be shining examples of service and commitment in A.A.

## "He Buildded Better Than He Knew June 1949"

THE scene was outside a funeral home. The policeman stationed there had seen many funerals. Big shots and little shots had gone to their rest from this place and, unless it was somebody special, the cop never paid too much attention.

This one was different somehow. A constant stream of people had come and gone. All kinds of people. Some arrived in big, shining cars, others in rattletraps. Still others came on foot, and not too well shod feet at that. The cop became curious enough to stop a likely looking man coming out. Jerking his thumb over his shoulder he asked, "Who was he? Some big politician?", "No.", "Rich guy?" "No.", "Somebody famous maybe? A writer or an actor, huh?"

No, none of these. It probably would have been useless to try to explain just who and what this man had been. It would have sounded melodramatic to say that this man, six years before, had been a drunken bum, a Bowery derelict. If he had died then there would have been no funeral, only a dismal burial in Potter's Field. There would have been no long lines of people to say "So long, pal!" to a well loved friend who would be missed. Six years ago if anyone had noticed at all it would have been to say, "Good ride!"

Even a friendly, sympathetic gendarme might find such a story hard to take. For in those 72 months this man had created no wealth in money, buildded no temples, achieved no fame. But to A.A.s he proved many things, even in death. However grim the thought, each of us realizes that he too must pass on someday and we wonder what the final accounting will be. Here was a friend whose life's balance sheet was in. And we could read it.

He had made an ugly failure, a shambles, of nearly a half century of living. Yet in six short years he had redeemed fifty, twice over. These had been years of deep humility, of good humor, of decency, of contentment, and best of all, of usefulness to hundreds and hundreds who desperately needed the help he had to give. There had been a family--lost, and rewon--who at the end were grief stricken--but proud!

So to us, young and old, and for however many years may be left to each of us, comes one final proof--the ultimate lesson. Maybe a curious cop wouldn't understand. But we need ask and work for no finer epitaph than these simple words: "He was a good A.A.!"
