The Advisory Board Meeting has been CHANGED to the Third (3rd) Wednesday of the month at 6;30 p.m.

Raising Literature Prices or Footing the Bill?

Our Fellowship has some challenges ahead. Presently, Seventh Tradition contributions to the General Service Board amount to about 70% of expenditures, with the balance, or 30%, made up by literature sales. The board then distributes the money based on the instructions we gave them through the Conference, and the authority we have placed on them through our Concepts.

The cost of our literature and books is directly proportionate to the amount of Seventh Tradition contributions received. So our question is, will our groups take responsibility and participate in their own recovery and the recovery of alcoholics to come? With fewer groups carrying more of the load of financial accountability.

Our groups have many choices today. They can choose to participate in Twelfth Step work or not. They may choose to be an isolated group. By that, I mean they could coast along, not growing. Every once in a while welcoming a newcomer who sees them in a group schedule, or perhaps one or two members doing corrections or institutions work, as long as it is close to home. Their Seventh Tradition funds being spent mostly on rent and refreshments. They do not contribute to entities outside their home group, intergroup or central

office. They hold with disdain the services done on behalf of their district, area or the General Service Board as wasteful and not mindful of the importance of the Seventh Tradition. They want their manay spent at home. They are a group that is virtually blind, does and muta. There is no G.S.R. to see or hope in

money spent at home. They are a group that is virtually blind, deaf, and mute. There is no G.S.R. to see or hear information from the General Service Office or the area, and no voice to communicate their group conscience.

These choices are made by some because of the belief that Tradition Four is the authority to not be part of A.A. as a whole. In a sense, they are correct. Tradition Four gives them the right to be autonomous, operating independently, with no one over them. However, that is only part of a much larger responsibility.

We are responsible to communicate the many paths that lead to recovery and Spiritual Awakening locally, nationally and worldwide. Our General Service Office began a program in 2006 that produced wonderful results. By bringing in the D.C.M.s, and including them in mailings detailing the work done nationally and internationally, our percentage of participation has increased. My own area has benefited by this inclusion. But what of the groups that are not registered, or the groups that are registered, but have made the choice not to participate?

Our choice as members of the Fellowship is clear. It is to discuss in unambiguous non-judgmental terms the work of A.A. inside our area, state or province, and country. We can clearly share the instructions given us in the Twelfth Step: To carry the message to alcoholics who still suffer. By this sharing, we can bring these groups into the realm of participation.

We can share that our Fellowship instructed the board to carry our work around the world. That is why the Big Book is printed in 52 languages, and Alcoholics Anonymous is in over 1 80 countries. We members are part or a society based on communication; one member talking to another. When we encounter an island or isolated group, or that member who has a provincial point of view, we can view it as an opportunity to share our structure. We are not in the activity of creating arguments; we are in the action of carrying the message of recovery and Spiritual Awakening.

When we join together supporting our district, area, and the General Service Office, our degree of self-support increases, thus no longer having to rely on the sale of literature to take up the slack in our revenue. This is our responsibility, to act as a conduit of information. An informed group is a knowledgeable group, and a knowledgeable group will recognize and understand our principle of self-support as written in Tradition Seven.
